Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan

Clear Creek County is a participant in the Denver Regional Council of Governments Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan. This multi-jurisdictional plan identifies natural hazards in the region, assesses their risk to communities, and identifies local mitigation strategies and outlines actions that will mitigate the hazards' effects and break the cycle of repetitive losses. The plan includes a risk assessment for the natural hazards by county, identification of the number of people and businesses potentially at risk, and the assessed valuation of properties vulnerable to each natural hazard. This information can be used to prioritize pre-disaster mitigation actions and post-disaster recovery efforts.
